Pride Flag

At the June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021 Council meeting an ad hoc committee was established to make a recommendation about putting up a pride flag at the front of the building. The committee members are Stuart Bailey, Samantha Gravel and Peter Haddow. The committee recommendations were outlined and discussed:

- A progressive pride flag will be placed on a support at the Algonquin entrance. The issue of vandalism was brought up, as this has been a problem in the downtown community. The flag will be high enough at top left corner of the building to try and minimize this possibility. The flag will have the Affirm United symbol and the United Church crest incorporated into the design.
- A small ceremony will be planned for September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021 to dedicate the flag. It will be brief, informal affair with several invited quests including members of *Out Loud* and local politicians. A suggestion was made to invite Tracy Davis, but it is understood she will be on holidays.
- An item will be prepared for the weekly newsletter to highlight the event and the meaning of the flag.
- It has been a while since we went through the Affirming process and decided to become an Affirming congregation. Are we dragging our feet? Members of Council feel this is an important step forward in our journey. The flag is a visible symbol of the work we have done to become more inclusive, but this work must be ongoing as there still appears to be hesitation by some members of our congregation about putting up the flag.
