Business Arising

Signing Officers The decision about who the RBC signing officers should be was deferred from the

previous meeting and after a brief discussion it was agreed by consensus that the

signing officers will remain unchanged at this time.

New Business

Financial Report Appendix I, II, II

• A draft of the 2023 budget (Appendix I) was circulated by email before this meeting. The following items were noted:

- The Building Use rental income is included with the fund r aising revenue. In 2022, we brought in \$13,784 in rental income. It is difficult to project a figure for 2023 based on the fact that we lost rental income in 2022 due to the basement flooding and we may lose some rental money this year if access to the church is affected by the downtown construction project.
- The Personnel budget is based on hiring a full-time minister at the highest pay rate starting in September.

• The Property budget is higher due in part to a large increase in our insurance premium starting in June 2023. This is due to a general price increase in premiums and the fact that we made a large claim to repair the flood damage.

Motion 011/23

Garth Goodhew/ Lorie Fairburn moved that the St. Andrew's Council recommends the 2023 draft budget be brought to the congregation for approval at the AGM as presented at this meeting.

- Lorie Fairburn offered the following Loaves & Fishes report. (Appendices II,III)
 - Lorie presented the food bank budget for 2023 (Appendix II). It is hard to estimate a budget for the food bank because of in-kind donations and the contributions from the Food Rescue Program offered through the Gathering Place. Food Recue donations are estimated at retail value for our purposes. The Gathering Place estimates the amount of food by the pound. Many of the offerings through this program are perishable, but if there is any doubt in the quality of the food it is discarded.
 - Expenses are higher due to the general societal increase in grocery prices and the fact that we have been welcoming more clients.

Motion 012/23

Lorie Fairburn/ Derek Stott moved that the St. Andrew's Council recommends the 2023 budget for Loaves & Fishes be accepted as presented. **Carried**

• Lorie recommended that Loaves & Fishes partner with March of Dimes to take advantage of their wage subsidy program which is intended to provide a mentorship opportunity and work experience for qualifying individuals. Lorie is recommending that the food bank hire Jolene Carter to do social media promotion for Loaves & Fishes for 9 to 11 weeks. The position would be for 10 hrs/wk paid at \$15.00/hr and the March of Dimes would provide a 75% subsidy. The cost to the food bank will be \$775 for 9 weeks.

Motion 013/23

Lorie Fairburn/ Elizabeth Brownlee moved that the St. Andrew's Council recommends that Loaves & Fishes hire Jolene Carter to do social media promotion through the wage subsidy program offered by March of Dimes. The position will be for 10 hours weekly at \$15/hr for up to 11 weeks and be subsidized at 75% by the March of Dimes. Carried

• Lorie highlighted several items from the written report found in Appendix III.

Liaisons <u>Administration</u> – Derek Stott reported that Building Use activity will be highlighted each week in the *Together* newssheet.

Living Our Mission – Derek Stott reported the following:

- The Inclusivity Committee will lead worship on March 12th with a discussion following the service to raise awareness of P.I.E. Day which happens on March 14th.
- Derek updated the project to update the outdoor security using the \$7,500 *Ontario Grant to Support Anti-Hate Security Measures for Faith-Based and Cultural Organizations* that we received. After receiving 2 quotes, Derek is recommending that we accept the \$7,410 quote from Boyer Electronics to add cameras to the narthex and outdoor lighting in the courtyard. The work must be completed by March 31st, 2022 under the terms of the grant.

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<u>Facility</u> – It was reported that the food bank room is now locked following an incident of food theft. Our Office Administrator has been asked to report any suspect activity in that area of the building that may show up on the security cameras. <u>Spiritual Life</u> – Elizabeth Brownlee offered the following:

- The theme for lent this year is *Sand and Silence*. Each Sunday worship will include a meditation time. For the next few weeks, worship will be led by Lillian Roberts, the Inclusivity Team, Tracy Davis and the Worship Team.
- The card ministry is continuing and Valentine's Day cards were distributed to 35 to 40 people. Volunteers are always welcome to help with this program and a lot of positive feedback has been received.
- Pastoral visits have returned to the hospital following COVID restrictions, although we don't currently have anyone doing this. Visiting has also started at Marina Point and the Empire.
- The Congregational Life Committee provided food for the Celebration of Life held for George Cole.
- Soup mix sales are continuing.

M&P Committee

Donna Landry reported that the M&P Committee is continuing its work to complete staff performance reviews. Currently, there is nothing else new to report.

Insurance

Garth Goodhew provided an update about the property insurance for the church.

- The basement flooding highlighted the need for adequate insurance coverage. Our insurance paid \$326,000 towards the required repairs of the basement with included new boilers. We only had to pay the \$5,000 deductible. Thanks to Reid Milne who worked closely with contractors and adjusters to ensure we received all the coverage we were due.
- Many insurance companies do not want to work with churches due to special
 coverage for things such as pipe organs and stained-glass windows. Currently our
 insurance is through HUB in cooperation with all United Churches. This system
 has been found to be inefficient and one result is that it has been very difficult to
 obtain quotes before renewal time in order to help with budgeting.
- A new system of coverage for United Churches is being implemented and \$3 million has been invested by the Church in partnership with AIG Insurance. Once fully in place, all churches will have their policies renew at the beginning of the year to better align with the church fiscal year. There will also be some coverage to cover outside groups that use church buildings, but the details of this are not known yet.
- Our coverage currently renews in June and this year the recommendation will be to renew for 6 months and switch to the new system beginning in 2024. Garth will be meeting with all our trustees to apprise them of the changes that are coming.

AGM The Annual General Meeting was scheduled for Sunday March 12th, 2023, however it was suggested that since Council has not yet approved the 2022 year-end statement and that the statement has yet to be reviewed, that the meeting should be postponed. It was agreed to rescheduled the meeting for Sunday April 16th, 2023 after worship.

Motion 014/23

Lorie Fairburn/ Karen Gooch moved that the St. Andrew's Council recommends the AGM be postponed until Sunday April 16th, 2023. **Carried**

Other Business

Easter Appeal The Easter stewardship appeal will include a mailout and the theme will be *Make a*

Joyful Noise. It is hoped that members of the choir will participate in this.

Round Table Members of Council were each given an opportunity to speak on the topic of their

choice. We were asked to make an effort more aware of United Church involvement in residential schools. We were also reminded us to hear Jolene Carter's story which is an example of what can happen when we welcome new people in our community. Kathie Smith joined the meeting by phone and she remarked about missing the warmth of an in-person meeting. Kudos were offered to the Worship Team for all the

work they have done each and every week so that we can continue to have

meaningful Sunday worship in the absence of a minister.

Adjournment The meeting adjourned with a prayer at 9:15 p.m.
